Background

<u>CHIPS (Christian International Peace Service)</u> runs long-term, grassroots, peacemaking projects around the world and we started our Brixton project in 2014. We run a lot of activities for young people aged 9-25 including drop-in sessions, holiday trips, schools mentoring, sports related activities and detached youthwork sessions. We also have activities supporting families and the wider community.

Purpose of the Role

We have a pool of Sessional Youth Workers who work with us during our regular weekly activities and who are also asked for availability for one-off events as needed. Our Youth Workers are key to us delivering high-quality, relationship-orientated youth activities. If you are interested in supporting young people in Brixton as they navigate the ups and downs of life, then we'd love to hear from you.

Responsibilities

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- 1. Running/Contributing to Youthwork sessions
- Preparing equipment, activities and the space before the session and packing away after, as required.
- Engaging young people who attend the session in the activities.
- Building relationships with and mentoring young people across sessions.
- Supporting young people to analyse their situations and identify ways forward.
- Ensuring the safety of young people during the session.
- Contributing ideas for how to improve the sessions or new activities requested by the young people.
- Undertaking basic monitoring activities.
- 2. Safeguarding
- To attend necessary safeguarding trainings.
- To ensure safeguarding procedures are followed during youthwork activities.
- To report any safeguarding concerns to the relevant safeguarding lead.
